Almighty God, who forgives all who truly repent, have mercy on us, pardon and deliver us from all our sins, confirm and strengthen us in all goodness, and keep us in life eternal; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**

We pray for our local schools are they prepare for the return of all pupils next week and all staff, children, and families. We pray for those who have found this week particularly difficult and challenging, for whatever reason, my they find the strength, support, and hope they need. Lord in your mercy. **Hear our prayer.**

We pray for all those who are ill at home or in hospital, for all in emergency surgery or in casualty, for those undergoing treatment or waiting for test results and a diagnosis, for those who have injuries or illnesses that will change their lives. In a moment of silence, we name before you any known to us who are suffering this day whether in body, mind, or spirit. *Silence*. Surround them and those who love and care for them with your healing, love and peace. We pray for the work of all who heal and comfort, all how visit and care for the sick and all who counsel the distressed. Lord in your mercy. **Hear our prayer.**

We pray for the dying and those who love them; we pray for those who have completed this life and have made the journey through death. We pray for all those who are grieving at this time, surround them with love, support, comfort, and hope. We pray for the work of those who comfort the bereaved. Lord in your mercy. **Hear our prayer.**

In a moment of silence, we offer our own prayers to God. *Silence*. Fill our hearts, O Lord, with thankfulness and praise as we recall your faithfulness and live in your love. Merciful Father; **accept these prayers for the sake of your son our saviour Jesus Christ. Amen**

Peace
